# LANGUAGE CLASS - 30h

Our courses are based on a conversation and task-based learning method. The groups consist of a maximum of 12 participants to ensure all students receive a high standard of learning.

## French courses

### Beginner Level 1

- Share information about themselves or their basic needs;
- Answer and formulate simple questions, mostly in present tense;
- Understand a limited number of words;
- Understand the simple requests and instructions that are given to them.

### Beginner Level 2

- Engage in conversations with others, formulate simple requests for information or assistance;
- Share information with other and develop a larger vocabulary;
- Understand basic requests and information given by others.

### Intermediate Level 1

- Higher ease in the language more involved conversations with others;
- Create informal presentations on familiar topics, such as basic needs, hobbies or interests;
- Understand the flow of conversations or speeches on familiar topics.

### Intermediate Level 2

- Communicate independently in informal conversations or presentations on concrete topics related to daily needs;
- Understand without assistance the content of conversations or speeches delivered at a regular pace in standard French, on specific topics related to daily needs.

## English courses

### Beginner Level 1

- Conjugate verbs at different tenses and use of the action verbs 'to be', 'to have', 'to do';
- Understand the use of prepositions like 'on', 'in' and 'at';
- Formulate simple question like 'Do you like ice cream?' or 'Are you in a good mood?'.

### Beginner Level 2

- Conjugate regular and irregular verbs at the simple past tense;
- Understand and become familiar with the past progressive tense (e.g. I was watching TV, we were eating dinner);
- Expand vocabulary.

### Intermediate Level 1

- Deepen the learning of the present progressive verb tense;
- Differentiate the distinction between 'to do' and 'to make';
- Expand vocabulary with the help of an oral presentation and classroom discussions.

### Intermediate Level 2

- Deepen the learning of phrasal verbs;
- Discover idiomatic expressions like 'spoil the goat and cabbage' and 'miss the boat';
- Develop and improve oral fluency through presentations.

## Spanish courses

### Level 1

- Ask simple questions and give personal information;
- Conjugate regular and irregular verbs at the present tense;
- Develop a basic vocabulary for greeting, telling time, ordering at the restaurant, etc.

### Level 2

- Ask for information and describe people's appearance and personality traits;
- Talk about the past, present and future;
- Expand vocabulary by talking about daily activities and hobbies, different rooms of a house, etc.
